Minutes of the June 19, 2009 Board Meeting

Approval of Minutes

Wayne Hunt moved to approve the minutes of the May 15, 2009 meeting as presented. Rodney Dick seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

Executive Director's Report

Mr. Stone called on Joel Neaveill to give the Executive Director's Report.

Mr. Neaveill noted the letter from the Fleming County Cattlemen's Association located in the update folder which thanked the KADB for implementing the menu approach statewide.

Mr. Neaveill called on Kylee Smith to give an update on the 11 Regional Workshops held throughout the state in April and May. A map located in the update folder showed the counties with participation.

Mr. Neaveill reported that a copy of the revised budget for A2009-0045 from Eastern Kentucky University located in the update folder.

Mr. Neaveill called attention to the updated referral list for the County Agricultural Investment Program (C.A.I.P.) in the update folder for the New Business portion of today's meeting.

Mr. Neaveill reported on the June 3rd Tobacco Settlement Agreement Fund Oversight Meeting and informed the Board that the next oversight meeting would be held on July 1, 2009.

Mr. Neaveill gave a report on Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy (GOAP) activities since the last Board Meeting: Governor Beshear and Roger Thomas attended the Biotechnology Industry Organization Convention in Atlanta; Roger Thomas attended the Western Kentucky University Mesonet/Youth Leadership meeting; Todd Harp, Christi Marksberry, Jennifer Hudnall, and Mike Tobin attended the National Value Added Agriculture Conference in Moline, Illinois; Tim Hughes attended a Dairy Transition Meeting; Mr. Thomas attended the Barren County Dairy Kickoff; Michael Judge attended the Kentucky Tobacco Research Board meeting; Roger Thomas and several staff attended Dairy Night at Applebee's Park; Roger Thomas, Tim Hughes, Christi Marksberry, Mike Tobin, Michael Judge and Todd Harp attended the Kentucky FFA Convention; Sam Lawson, Roger Thomas, Tim Hughes and Michael Judge attended the Kentucky Agriculture Council Board Meeting; Tim Hughes attended the Interim Joint Agriculture Committee Meeting held at Griffin Industries; Jennifer Hudnall and Christi Marksberry attended the Louisville Crossroad Field Day; Tim Hughes attended the Kentucky Agricultural Heritage Center meeting; Tim Hughes attended the Kentucky Agriculture Council Agri-energy Committee meeting.

The fiscal year ends on June 30, 2009 and Mr. Neaveill reminded the Board Members to turn in their travel vouchers for the 2008-2009 fiscal year by July 10, 2009.

Mr. Neaveill referred to the Monitoring and Compliance and reported on the expired application, A2008-0284 Grasslands Dairy Cattle.

Mr. Neaveill reported that Angela Blank will be the new World Equestrian Games Agricultural Liaison and Director of Public Affairs for the GOAP.

Mr. Neaveill called on Bill McCloskey to give a report on the financial position of the Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corporation. Mr. McCloskey referred to the report in the Board Book (on file with the Board Secretary), which shows the balance of accounts as of May 31, 2009. **Wayne Mattingly moved that the report be accepted; Jim Sidebottom seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

The Executive Director's report concluded. No action was taken on the Executive Director's report.

Report

The Beef Connection, LLC-Bob Sand, Owner, provided a status report on the Beef Connection activities and his plans for the future for the program.

New Business

Referral of July 17, 2009 Projects

Mr. Stone noted that the referrals were updated to include all applications received before June 12, 2009. Mr. Stone referenced applications A2009-0057, A2009-0071, A2009-0074, A2009-0088, A2009-0089, A2009-0103, A2009-0111, A2009-0115, A2009-0116, A2009-0118, A2009-0119, A2009-0119, A2009-0120, A2009-0120, A2009-0121, A2009-0122, A2009-0123, A2009-0124, A2009-0124, A2009-0125, A2009-0126, A2009-0127, A2009-0128, A2009-0132.

Dean Smith moved that said referrals be approved; Wayne Hunt seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

Programs Recommended for Approval¹

Approval of County Agricultural Investment Program (C.A.I.P.) Recommendations

Mr. Stone submitted 28 projects requesting county funds meeting state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Rodney Dick moved for approval of the submitted C.A.I.P. applications; Jim Mahan seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Approval of Deceased Farm Animal Disposal Assistance Program²

Mr. Stone submitted seven Deceased Farm Animal Disposal Assistance Programs (DFADAP) projects requesting county funds, meeting state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Pat Henderson moved for approval of the submitted DFADAP applications; Jim Sidebottom seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Pilot Farm Management Program

Mr. Stone submitted three Pilot Farm Management projects requesting county funds, meeting state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Jim Mahan moved for approval of the submitted Pilot Farm Management applications; Dr. Sias seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Shared-use Equipment Program

Mr. Stone submitted four Shared-use Equipment projects requesting county funds, meeting state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Rodney Dick moved for approval of the submitted Shared-use Equipments applications; Don Goodin seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Requested Amendments³

Mr. Stone presented ten requested amendments for approval. **Wayne Hunt moved for approval of the submitted amendments; Jim Mahan seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Memo Action Items

Todd Harp presented a memorandum regarding A2007-0026. The Kentucky Entrepreneurial Coaches Institute is requesting an amendment to the wording of their current legal agreement. The current legal agreement states that those chosen for each class of the institute must “come from” one of the identified 22 tobacco dependent south central Kentucky counties. The requested amendment would read; “the selected fellows shall be Kentucky residents that reside and/or work at least 51% of the time in one or a combination of the identified 22 counties.” Staff is recommending approval of this request. **Jim Mahan moved to accept staff recommendation; Dr. Sias seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented a memorandum regarding A2007-0391. Lee’s Plant Farm was approved for \$10,000 in LaRue County funds at the February 15, 2008 KADB meeting to construct a “Kentucky Freshest” concept store. To date, \$6,695 has been expended for the project. The owners of Lee’s Plant Farm are requesting to substitute some of the original items from their budget. Staff recommends approving this request for reallocation using the \$3,305 remaining in the allotment. **Wayne Hunt moved to accept staff recommendation; Jim Sidebottom seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented a memorandum regarding A2008-0023. Porchetta Primata, LLC was approved for \$87,693 in State funds and \$3,000 in Todd County funds at the April 18, 2008 KADB meeting to purchase a porchetta oven, a vacuum packer, and stainless steel tables. Porchetta Primata is now requesting to use those funds to retire a bank loan on previously purchased existing equipment. Staff recommends denial of this request. **Sam Lawson moved to accept staff recommendation; Wayne Hunt seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Jennifer Hundall presented a memorandum regarding A2008-0484. Central Kentucky Custom Meats (CKCM) was approved for \$104,679 as a 0% interest loan in State funds at the February 20, 2009 KADB meeting. CKCM was allotted a period of six months from the date of the executed legal agreement to secure county funds. The secured county funds would be awarded as a grant and applied to the outstanding loan balance. In March, the KADB approved a Casey County commitment of \$50,000 in county funds for the project. Subsequently, the Washington County Agricultural Development Council committed \$20,000 in county funds with a high priority to this project. Staff recommends approving this commitment to CKCM as a grant, and applying the funds to the outstanding loan balance. The repayment schedule will be amortized accordingly. Ms. Hudnall reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. **Rodney Dick moved to accept staff recommendation; Don Goodin seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Michael Judge presented a memorandum regarding A2009-0025. The Estill County Conservation District has requested an amendment to project A2009-0025 in the amount of \$1,260. The application was approved at the March 20, 2009 meeting of the KADB for the purchase of a no-till drill under the Shared-use Equipment program. The bids on the implement had expired at the time of approval by the KADB. This request includes \$460 for one-half of the increase in cost of the drill and \$800 for administration fees that were not requested in the original application. Staff recommends approval of the \$460 for the increase in cost of the drill and denying the request for the \$800 for the administrative fees. **Dean Smith moved to accept staff recommendation; Pat Henderson seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Recommendations for Funding

Jennifer Hudnall presented A2009-0021, Thoroughbred RC&D Council, Inc. The Thoroughbred RC&D Council requests \$883,400 in State funds and \$5,000 in Scott County Funds for ongoing investment obligations toward existing regional and statewide farmland preservation efforts. Staff recommends NO FUNDING this request for \$883,400 of STATE funds due to ongoing investment obligations toward existing regional and statewide farmland preservation efforts. Staff recommends FUNDING this request in the amount of \$5,000 in Scott County funds pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Sam Lawson moved that A2009-0021 be approved for \$5,000 in Scott County funds and no**

funded for \$883,400 in State funds; Sam Moore seconded the motion. Troy Rankin moved to amend the motion to approve \$440,000 in State funds. Jim Mahan seconded the amendment. The amendment failed. The original motion passed with Troy Rankin and Rodney Dick dissenting.

Jennifer Hudnall presented A2009-0034, Shelby County Fiscal Court. The Shelby County Fiscal Court requests \$10,000 in Shelby County funds to provide dead animal removal services for the 2009 fiscal year expenditures in Shelby County. Ms. Hudnall reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Wayne Mattingly moved that A2009-0034 be approved for \$10,000 in Shelby County funds; Jim Mahan seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Todd Harp presented A2009-0036, God's Pantry Food Bank, Inc. God's Pantry Food Bank, Inc. requests \$62,500 in combination of State (\$30,000) and county funds (\$32,000) from Bath, Clark, Fayette, Lincoln, Pulaski, and Scott counties funds. The applicant is requesting funds to purchase 15 types of Kentucky grown surplus produce at a fair price and distribute it to low-income clients throughout their 50 county service area of central and eastern Kentucky. Mr. Harp reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Pat Henderson moved that A2009-0036 be approved for \$60,000 in a combination of State (\$30,000) and county funds (\$30,000) from Bath, Clark, Fayette, Lincoln, Pulaski, and Scott counties in the form of a grant; Rodney Dick seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Jennifer Hudnall presented A2009-0039, Crystal Bridge Fish Farm Limited Liability Company. Crystal Bridge Fish Farm Limited Liability Company requests \$137,196.50 in State funds to develop a system of efficient mono sex culture for producing male only tilapia fingerlings. Ms. Hudnall reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project for the reduced amount of \$95,800 in State funds in the form a 0% interest loan amortized over 10 years with a one year grace period pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Dr. Sias moved to pend A2009-0039 so that additional information could be obtained. Troy Rankin seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Old Business

Jim Mahan moved go into closed session to discuss pending litigation pursuant to KRS 61.810(1) (c). Rodney Dick seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. Open session adjourned at 11:50 a.m. Dr. Sias moved to return to open session; Don Goodin seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent. Open session reconvened at 11:59 a.m. No action was taken during closed session.

The meeting recessed for lunch at 12:00 p.m.

The meeting reconvened at 12:57 p.m.

Jennifer Hudnall presented A2009-0040, Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government/Economic Development Department. The Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government/Economic Development Department requests \$120,000 over two years in State funds to fund a Public Interest Broker (PIB) that will work to increase direct farmer access to Louisville food markets. Ms. Hudnall reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends funding this project for the reduced amount of \$57,750 in STATE funds and \$500 in Henry County Funds, \$500 in Spencer County funds, \$500 in Jefferson County funds, \$500 in Trimble County funds, and \$250 in Oldham County funds in the form of a grant for one year pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Dr. Sias moved that A2009-0040 be approved for \$87,750 in State funds and \$500 of Henry County funds, \$500 of Spencer County funds, \$500 of Jefferson County funds, \$500 of Trimble County Funds, and \$250 of Oldham County funds for a total of \$90,000 in the form of a grant for 18 months; Vickie Yates Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed with y Rodney Dick, Jim Mahan, Sam Moore, and Dean Smith dissenting. Dean Smith moved to amend the motion to change the term from 18 months to 24 months; Sam Lawson seconded the amendment. The amendment passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented A2009-0042, Memphis Bioworks Foundation-AgBio. The Memphis Bioworks Foundation-AgBio requests \$2,000 in county funds from the Purchase area counties to conduct a regional business plan and implementation strategy intended to grow biosciences in the region. These Purchase area counties include Ballard, Calloway, Carlisle, Fulton, Hickman, Graves, McCracken, and Marshall counties. Ms. Marksbury reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project for \$250 in Ballard County funds, \$250 in Calloway County funds, \$250 in Carlisle County funds, and \$250 in Graves County funds pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Rodney Dick moved that A2009-0042 be approved for \$250 in Ballard County funds, \$250 in Calloway County funds, \$250 in Carlisle County funds, and \$250 in Graves County funds; Dean Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented A2009-0043, Logan County Extension District Board. The Logan County Extension District Board requests \$50,000 in State funds and \$100,000 in Logan County funds to construct a multi-purpose facility for Logan and surrounding counties. Ms. Marksbury reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this request for \$100,000 in Logan County funds and \$5,000 in Todd County funds and no funding the request for \$50,000 in State funds pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Sam Moore moved that A2009-0043 be approved for**

\$100,000 in Logan County funds and \$5,000 in Todd County funds. Jim Mahan seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

Michael Judge presented A2009-0044, The Russell County Farmers Market Association, Inc. The Russell County Farmers Market Association, Inc. requests \$3,500 in Russell County funds to purchase a mobile building assembly for their farmers market to provide shelter in inclement weather. Mr. Judge reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project for \$3,500 in Russell County funds pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Jim Mahan moved that A2009-0044 be approved for \$3,500 in Russell County funds; Rodney Dick seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented A2009-0064, Kentucky Home Pork Producers Association. The Kentucky Home Pork Producers Association requests \$10,000 in Nelson County Funds to administer a Swine Diversification Model Program. Ms. Marksbury informed the KADB that this project had been delayed due to an illness by the administrator and she reviewed the proposed terms and conditions for the project. Staff recommends approving this project for \$10,000 in Nelson County funds pending meeting all state program guidelines and compliance standards. **Dr. Sias moved that A2009-0064 be approved for \$10,000 in Nelson County Funds; Jim Mahan seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Recommendations for No Funding

Michael Judge presented A2009-0028, Owens Garden Center, LLC. Owens Garden Center, LLC requests \$221,787.50 in State funds and \$15,000 in County funds for purchasing greenhouse structures to expand their business to a full-line garden center. Staff recommends no-funding this project since the applicant was unable to document significant benefit to multiple producers. **Jim Mahan moved to pend A2009-0028 so that additional information could be obtained; Wayne Mattingly seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Christi Marksbury presented A2009-0068, Green River Area Beef Improvement Group, Inc. The Green River Beef Improvement Group, Inc. requests \$114,116 in Hancock County Funds. Staff recommends no-funding this project due to low priority from the Hancock County Agricultural Development Council. **Pat Henderson moved to accept staff recommendation; Jim Sidebottom seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.**

Recommendations for Pending Funding

The following applications were presented, but no action was taken: Cravens Farm Greenhouse (A2009-0035); Elliott County Extension District Board (A2009-0037); Elliott County Extension District Board (A2009-0038); Kentucky Organic Farm and Feed, Inc. (A2009-00041); Eastern Kentucky University (A2009-0045); The Kentucky Center for Agriculture and Rural Development, Inc. (A2009-0047).

Requested Change	The applicant requests an additional \$30,000 for the <i>Hay, Straw, & Commodity Storage Model Program</i> . The request received a high priority from the Fayette County Agriculture Development Council. The term of the program shall remain 18-months from the execution date of the original agreement.
