

**Call to Order**

James R. Comer, Commissioner, Kentucky Department of Agriculture (KDA), presiding, called the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board (KADB) regular business meeting to order at 10:08 a.m. (EDT).

**Roll Call**

Comer, Vice Chairman; Dr. Betty Bailey; Karen Curtis; Don Goodin (designee for Secretary Larry Hayes); Pat Henderson; Wayne Mattingly; Sam Moore; Troy Rankin; Dr. Kimberly Holmes (designee for President Mary Evan Sias); Jim Sidebottom; Dean M. Scott Smith.

**Notification of Media**

Commissioner Comer received verification that the media has been notified of the KADB regular business meeting.

**Welcome**

Commissioner Comer welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave an update on the audit of the KDA.

Commissioner Comer gave his appreciation of the KADB for their support of KDA's Kentucky Proud program. In addition, Commissioner Comer requested that KDA give a presentation at the July board meeting held at the Kentucky State Fair.

**Approval of Minutes**

Troy Rankin moved to approve the minutes from the April 20, 2012 KADB regular business meeting as presented; Dr. Betty Bailey seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous

#### **Executive Director's Report**

Roger Thomas, executive director of the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy (GOAP), called on John McCauley, executive director of the Kentucky Farm Service Agency (FSA), to give a report to the board.

Mr. McCauley thanked GOAP for their participation in the Guaranteed Lender Meetings. Mr. McCauley gave his appreciation of Commissioner Comer and Mr. Thomas along with their Chiefs of Staff in meeting with the FSA to discuss how the federal and state partnership can better serve the Kentucky farmer. Mr. McCauley stated a proclamation signing would be held on May 29 in the Governor's Office celebrating 150 years since the founding of the "People's Department" under President Abraham Lincoln known today as the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) in Washington.

Mr. Thomas introduced Biff Baker as the new Project Manager for GOAP. Mr. Baker has a wealth of experience working for the Legislative Research Commission (LRC) with regards to agriculture. Mr. Baker began his employment with GOAP on May 16, 2012 and will be working on project applications.

Mr. Thomas introduced Tammy Brookshier who will become the new Program Coordinator for GOAP. Ms. Brookshier currently is the CAIP Program Administrator for the Shelby County Cooperative Extension Office in Shelby County. Ms. Brookshire start work on June 1, 2012 and will be working on CAIP, Deceased Farm Animal Removal and Shared-Use applications.

Mr. Thomas called on Angela Blank, director of public affairs at GOAP, to give an update on the upcoming 2-day KADB/KAFC June Board Meeting.

Mr. Thomas called on Bill McCloskey, director of financial services at GOAP, to give the Kentucky Agricultural Finance Corporation (KAFC) Financial Report.

#### **Statement of Financial Position**

Mr. McCloskey reviewed the KAFC Statement of Financial Position (on file with the Board Secretary) as of April 30, 2012.

Wayne Mattingly moved to accept the KAFC Financial Report; Jim Sidebottom seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous

Mr. Thomas informed the board that today is the last board meeting for Diane Fleming, general counsel at GOAP. Ms. Fleming has taken on a position with the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources. Mr. Thomas commended Ms. Fleming for her work and dedication over the past four years.

### **Memo Action Items**

Commissioner Comer called on staff to present Memo Action Items to the Board for consideration.

#### **A2011-0154     Edmonton-Metcalfe County Industrial Authority**

Mr. McCloskey presented a memorandum (on file with the Board Secretary, dated May 18, 2012) regarding the above-referenced project. The Recipient has requested to amend the current project to include \$11,000 in Metcalfe County funds to be matched by State funds in the amount of \$11,000 for the blueberry marketing facility in Metcalfe County. This amendment brings the funding totals to \$23,000 in Metcalfe County and \$23,000 in State funds.

Sam Moore moved to approve the recommendation, Mr. Rankin seconded the motion.

Commissioner Comer referenced, for the Board's consideration, six (6) County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP) applications requesting county funds totaling \$1,216,360; three (3) Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program applications requesting county funds totaling \$19,500; three (3) Shared Use Equipment applications requesting county funds and one (1) 2012 Shared Use Equipment Initiative applications requesting state funds for a total of \$28,063.

Mr. Sidebottom moved to approve the program recommendations as presented; Karen Curtis seconded the motion.

**Requested Program Amendments<sup>3</sup>**

Commissioner Comer called on staff to present the Project Recommendations for Funding.

**A2012-0043 Woodford County Board of Education**

Mr. McCloskey presented the above-referenced project from Woodford County Board of Education requesting \$33,250 in Woodford County funds to construct a new greenhouse on the grounds of Woodford County High School.

The White Application Review Committee recommends funding this request for \$33,250 in Woodford County Funds

**KADF On-Farm Energy Efficiency and Production Incentives Program<sup>4</sup>**

Ms. Justice presented a list of 81 On-Farm Energy Efficiency and Production Incentives Program applications recommended for approval totaling \$696,288.. Ms. Justice stated that 84 applications were received as of April 30, 2012 with three (3) of those being denied<sup>5</sup> as non-qualifying. Ms. Justice informed the board that each of the 81 qualifying and approved applications will receive a legal agreement along with site visits and photos prior to reimbursement of submitted receipts.

Dr. Bailey moved to approve the recommendation as submitted; Dr. Kimberly Holmes seconded the motion.



Mr. Henderson moved to adjourn the KADB regular business meeting; Dean Smith seconded the motion.


